All entry forms are to be submitted to the SRMAS no later than Midnight Friday August 31, 2018. Poultry Exhibits must be submitted by Monday August 28, 2018 with entry fee.

Late Entries will NOT be accepted

How to enter in the SRMAS Hall Classes

#1 Find a prize list/SRMAS Fair Book (this book)

-You can find this online at <http://www.machartownship.net/events.html> , you can email us srmasff@gmail.com or pick up a paper copy at Jessie's KwikWay in South River or call us 705 386 8413 for help.

#2 Carefully read the Fair Book

#3 Choose the Exhibits you want to enter, noting that anyone may enter in their own age category or may enter any category older than their age but may not enter a category for an age group younger than their age. You will receive prize money but not points for winnings outside of your true age category.

#4 Enjoy making/creating your entries. Please note that hall class exhibits can only be shown for 2 years.

#5 Download an "Online SRMAS 2018 Hall Class Entry Form" from <http://www.machartownship.net/events.html> , fill out the entry form and email it to us at srmasff@gmail.com or print the entry form and mail your entry form to SRMAS PO Box 459 South River On POA 1X0 before August 31, 2018 (late entries will not be accepted)

#6 Our volunteers will contact you about where and when to pick up your entry tags (these tags are used to identify the class for each of your entries and to identify you, the competitor)

#7 Safely and securely attach your entry tags to your exhibits and ensure that the bottom of your tags is closed so your name is not visible.

#8 Bring your exhibits and your membership fee (\$3 for adults and free for children) to the SRMAS Fair Grounds, A1 Lincoln Ave. South River On (South River Arena/Community Centre) on **Thursday Sept. 6 between the hours of 6 pm to 9 pm or Friday Sept 7 between the hours of 8am to 12 pm** where our volunteers will greet you and place your exhibits in the hall for judging. Please note that (with a few exceptions) exhibitors are not allowed in the hall class area, our volunteer will place your items for you).

#9 Enjoy the anticipation and excitement of awaiting the judge's decisions. The exhibits will be judged on Friday Sept. 7 from 2 pm to 4 pm, at which time the Hall will be CLOSED to everyone excepting the judges and their clerks.

#10 Come to the fair on Saturday, enjoy yourself, see how you placed and enjoy some well-earned bragging rights.

#11 In the event that that you notice a mistake or question the judge's decision, feel that a rule has been violated, or something is amiss, please be sure let us know. Go to the Office, fill out a hall class Concern Form. Give it to the staff in our office. We will do our very best to assist with your concerns in a timely manner.

#12 Pick up your Hall Class Entry at 3:30pm on Saturday Sept. 8 in the Hall Class area. An exhibitor who removes their entry before this time will forfeit their prize money.

#13 Enjoy attending the **Awards Ceremony** where the awards and prize money will be distributed. More details on the Awards Ceremony will be available when you drop off your exhibits for the fair.

For those who do not have internet access please mail your entry form to Attention Hall Class, South River Machar Agricultural Society, PO Box 459 South River, ON P0A 1X0 before AUGUST 31,2018 for Homecrafts and AUGUST 27, 2018 for Chickens.

Entry Forms for Light Horse Classes are due to the Light Horse Director on the Saturday morning of the Fall Fair Sept 8, but you may download the Online SRMAS 2018 Light Horse Games entry form and email it to srmasff@gmail.com if you would like, you will be asked to confirm your entries on Saturday morning.

Membership fee for those over 18 years of age is \$3 and is due at the January Annual General Meeting or when entering the Hall Classes, Poultry and Livestock Classes or the Light Horse Show in September at Fair time. Membership entitles you to a vote at the Annual General Meeting and to enter any Hall Classes.

There is no membership fee for juniors (12 years and under) or teens (13 to 18 years) except if they wish to enter into the adult classes, in which case they will be required to pay the \$3 membership fee. Please note: Exhibitors may enter their age category, and if they wish may enter higher age categories. However, exhibitors may not enter a lower age category.

Vegetables and Fruits are judged in accordance with the "Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Horticultural and Floral Design" which is printed and distributed by the Ontario Horticultural Association of Garden Clubs of Ontario. A copy may be purchased at the following website: <http://www.gardenontario.org/shop/>

- 1) Beans 5 – 3 inches or longer (Do not wash, Wipe gently with a soft cloth. Should be uniform in size)
- 2) Tomatoes -3 ripe, any type over 2 inches in diameter. (Leave 1-inch stem attached to the tomato)
- 3) Zucchini - 2 green, maximum of 8 inches long.
- 4) Cabbage - (trim stem to ½ inch, trim heads down to 2 layers of sound freed outer leaves)
- 5) Onions- 2 (remove roots just below base of bulb, remove only jagged and dirty outer leaves, cut top off ½ to 1 inch above bulb)
- 6) Cucumbers -5 pickling, maximum of 4 inches long. (trim stem to ¼ inch)
- 7) Tomatoes- 3 ripe cherry/patio stems on
- 8) Carrots- 5 minimum of 3 inches (tops removed ½ inch above the crown, tap roots left on)
- 9) Cucumber – slicing type, over 6 inches long (trim stem to ¼ inch)
- 10) Apples- 4 any variety
- 11) Crabapples- 6 any variety
- 12) Watermelon -1
- 13) any other fruit, 4 home grown, must be labeled
- 14) Largest Pumpkin (in size we will not be weighing them)
- 15) Longest Zucchini
- 16) Largest Tomato
- 17) Tallest Sunflower
- 18) Largest Sunflower Head (circumference)
- 19) Chives

#2 Carefully read the Fair Book

#3 Choose the Exhibits you want to enter. Entry fee is \$0.50 per rabbit or bird, each member may enter a maximum of 25 rabbits or birds.

#4 Download an "Online SRMAS 2017 Poultry, Waterfowl and Rabbits Entry Form" from <http://www.machartownship.net/events.html> , fill out the entry form and email it to us at srmassff@gmail.com or print the entry form and mail your entry form to SRMAS PO Box 459 South River On P0A 1X0 on or before Sept 1, 2017 (LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE EXCEPTED)

#5 Our volunteers will prepare Poultry and Livestock tags and will attach these tags to the poultry cages and have them ready for you on Saturday Sept 8 by 7:30 am.

#6 Bring your poultry or livestock to the SRMAS Fairgrounds A1Lincoln Ave. South River On, to be cooped (you will need to coop your animals in the prepared cages) between 7:45 and 9:30 am. Entry Fee Payments are due prior to the fair on Monday August 27, 2018

#7 Judging starts at 10am sharp and the livestock barn will be "close to the public" Please note that any exhibitor found to be interfering with the judges or animals at this time will be disqualified. Any animal entered contrary to the rules will be disqualified. Any animal in poor condition will be disqualified and any animal which appears to be sick will not be allowed to enter and you will be expected to remove that animal from the fairgrounds.

#8 You must be sure to provide food and water (there is a water tap on site) for your animals throughout the day.

#9 All poultry and livestock displays are to remain on the Fairgrounds until 4pm or prize money will be forfeited.

Note:

-No exhibitor will be allowed to enter more than 2 entries per article number, regardless of the sex of the animal

-Young female and young male must be over 4 months of age and under one year of age

-Birds and Rabbits to be sexed in the following way:

OF=old female, OM=old male, YF=young female, YM=Young male

- Entries are limited to the space we have available, in the event that we run out of cages, our livestock director will contact you by the Thursday Sept. 7, to request that you bring your own cages if needed.
